- Students bring class answer to office as a note
- Class with most answers correct over a period of time wins a prize. Or, first sent down with the correct answer wins.

OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last episode we learned that reliability means you can be counted on ... every time, all the time! Today, we will see that because Pester isn't reliable on a promise he made, Achiever almost sneezes his head off! Enjoy the show!

CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What did Pester want to purchase so badly? **ANSWER:** An Elvis autographed bowling ball

Episode 5: Respect

OPENING STATEMENT:

We hope you enjoyed the previous episode about reliability – it sure is important to be able to depend on others! Today, we're going to see that BJ Badger has a very hard time showing respect to other students. Respect simply means that you follow the Golden Rule and treat others how you want to be treated! Enjoy the show!

CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What sport does BJ Badger compete in? **ANSWER:** Swimming

OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last show, BJ Badger failed to treat other swimmers with respect - he didn't follow the Golden Rule and treat others the way that he'd like to be treated. Today, we'll see that another College Crew member - Precious Porcupine - could also learn a few pointers about treating others with respect. Let's see what happens!

CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:
