## Quick Opening and Closing Statements for PA System

General Directions:

- 1) The opening statement is **highly** suggested as it prepares the students for the lesson.
- 2) The closing review question is **optional** - but is also **highly** suggested as a schoolwide contest. Teachers can e-mail the answer to the office - or students can bring written notes to the office with an answer for their class. The class with the most answers either correct or sent first to the office over "X" amount of time gets a prize! This is a highly effective method of adding to the schoolwide interest, and it does a great job of **enhancing** student attention. With classes discussing the answer, the question also gives teachers a built in opportunity to review with their kids the main idea of the show.

## Episode 1: Responsibility

### OPENING STATEMENT:

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

## Episode 5: Respect

### OPENING STATEMENT:

We hope you enjoyed the previous McRadio episode about reliability – it sure is important to be able to depend on others! Today, we're going to see that BJ Badger has a very hard time showing respect to other students. Respect simply means that you follow the Golden Rule and treat others how you want to be treated! Enjoy the show!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What sport does BJ Badger compete in? **ANSWER:** Swimming



## Episode 6: Respect

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last show, BJ Badger failed to treat other swimmers with respect - he didn't follow the Golden Rule and treat others the way that he'd like to be treated. Today, we'll see that another College Crew member - Precious Porcupine - could also learn a few pointers about treating others with respect. Let's see what happens!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

## Episode 7: Courtesy

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last episode, we saw how Precious Porcupine treated her friends with a lack of respect. Today, we'll learn about courtesy. We'll see that Pester upsets Achiever because he doesn't use his manners. You never look silly saying please, excuse me, and thank you! Enjoy the show!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What was the name of the trick that Pester did in the cafeteria? **ANSWER:** Seafood trick!



## Episode 8: Courtesy

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In our last show, we saw that Pester might have lost his friendship with Achiever because he was being so rude. Having courtesy and using your manners is really that important! Today, Glory "Got Game" LeGoose tries to cheer Pester up and help him repair his friendship with Achiever. Enjoy the show!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What does Wonkers always say after he gives bad advice? **ANSWER:** Zatabang!



## Episode 9: Honesty

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last episode, Pester the Squirrel was able to repair his friendship with Achiever even though he wasn't using his manners. In today's show, we'll see that Pester's problems are just beginning. On a class assignment, Pester isn't very honest and he gets into trouble. Never do things that you'll wish you hadn't after you are caught!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What's the name of the device Ellison uses to monitor how much others care? **ANSWER:** ICAREPOD



## Episode 10: Honesty

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last show, we saw that honesty is the best policy. When we lie, cheat, or steal - all that leads to is big trouble. In this episode, we'll see that Barry VonBearhugger learns this lesson the hard way. Never do things you'll wish you hadn't **after** you are caught! Enjoy the show!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What was the name of the pie that Barry bought at the store? **ANSWER:** Energy Bar Pie



## Episode 11: Truthfulness

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In the last episode, we saw that we should always be honest and avoid doing things that we'll regret **after** we are caught. Today, we'll learn about truthfulness. Sometimes, we need to tell the truth - even when we get in trouble for it. Pester learns that when you tell a part truth, you've still told a whole lie! Enjoy the show!

### CLOSING CONTEST QUESTION:

What did Pester tell Achiever he could fix? **ANSWER:** His Car



## Episode 12: Truthfulness

### OPENING STATEMENT:

In our last show, Pester got caught in a part truth and part lie - but luckily everything worked out for him. In this episode, the boys learn that sometimes telling the truth is really scary and hard - but it is always the best way!
